Staff Changes






We are excited to welcome Stefanie Moore as the Director of Reentry Programs. Stefanie holds an MA in Criminal Justice and brings great experience to this role.

She is an adjunct instructor in Criminal Justice at both Maryville and Lindenwood Universities. She was most recently the Site Director for Ashland University's Correctional Educational Program at Missouri Eastern Correctional Center. Her career includes experience at Gateway Foundation as a Reentry Specialist Supervisor, and at Keyway (formerly CWIT) as a Reentry Case Manager, and working with juveniles and families entangled in the foster care system. She serves on several boards across the St. Louis, including as Chairperson, and is a trained community mediator for Community Mediations of St. Louis. Stefanie also served as the Research Chair for St. Louis Alliance for Reentry (STAR) in the past.

In October, Paul Faust will begin a transition from Case Manager for the Release to Rent Veterans program to become the Volunteer and Ministry Coordinator. Paul has been involved with CJM for many years, starting as a volunteer, and then as a practicum student. He has served as a Board Member and facilitated Peer Support Groups before becoming a case manager in the R2R Veterans program. R2R Veterans graduate Kurt shared how CJM impacts those who are returning from incarceration. He explained that despite his advantages (education, military experience, technology skills) compared to so many others exiting incarceration, he still ran into the many barriers that formerly incarcerated people face. Employers were reluctant to hire someone who had a record and had been out of the workforce for many years. Landlords would not rent to someone with a record who had not been working. It was difficult for him to put his skills and education to use. Thankfully, with the support of our Release to Rent Veterans team. Kurt was able to overcome those obstacles and realize his potential. He is employed in his field and generously volunteers his technical expertise to support CJM in our mission.
