I'm thankful I have been given permission to share this. Marlon served 20 years inside Farmington Correctional. Three months before his release he discovered CJM after being denied housing countless of times. He had such a hard time he thought there was no way, until your gracious support let him in. The man who was once surrounded by trauma is not the man of today. He aspires to become a mentor and dreams of a day when he can have a bible study where he is welcomed. He told me every day he is thankful for his new life and humbled by the support he has received. Below is what he shared at the Recognition Dinner.

Life is more than second chances. I'm a living testimony of it. I never thought that I would be given an opportunity to better myself, considering my condition. The opportunity came by being introduced to a phenomenal organization CJM, Criminal Justice Ministry. They genuinely care and concern for those in desperate need of shelter. I can't deny where I come from but can learn from it. As well, I can build up on it towards success, me. I want to tell those out there to be determined, even more soto invest in you - despite delays, setbacks, and detours. Remember that someone has personally went through similar circumstances or someone close to them. Being allowed through CJM to make this speech, it's time for me to show gratitude by showing what life looks like from someone who learned from past mistakes and chose to change. The man that I am today has established proper structure in my life. A man that has more compassion, respect, and understanding for others. I am a person who wants to openly share his experiences of bad choices with others in hopes that they won't travel down the wrong path I choose. Today I see myself as a better Civilized Citizen, Father, Son, Brother, Uncle, Friend, Nephew, Cousin and Grandfather. I see myself helping people instead of harming them. I've seen how dark my past was. Now I'm moving forward to the light, which I want to make shine. Who am I today, many may ask? A person that's willing, ready, and able to make positive steps forward in rebuilding back my life. This person I am today seeks positive advice from others in hopes that the choices I would make will help me obtain a healthy and safe lifestyle. Lastly, I would like to give the highest honor that any son could give, and that is to my mother, I really appreciate everything that she has done for me, she has encouraged me, and stood by me during the darkest times. I want to give special thanks to Terryl and thanks to all the other staff and volunteers that work at CJM. It was complete bodywork, with people carrying a true concern; if I ever needed to talk with anyone, if I had any problems, they could connect me with the right resources.
