


Hello 2025!

## Construction Update: Spring and Dunnica

CJM acquired the 16-unit apartment building in 2019. With generous funding from the Affordable Housing Commission and the Mental Health Board, rehab was able to begin.

The building has been a massive rehab project involving new electric, plumbing, flooring, appliances and refreshed paint. As the apartments became habitable, CJM clients were housed there as they returned to the community from incarceration.

CJM is proud to announce the last 5 apartments are in the final stages of rehab completion. These 5 apartments are vital to provide additional shelter and stability to ensure our clients have the best chance to rebuild their lives.

### Client Highlight: Terry L. Huey



CJM works tirelessly to help those we serve regain their own autonomy. Nothing pleases our organization more than hearing and sharing stories of clients' successes. Below is one of those amazing stories of resilience, rebuild and gratitude in the client Terry's own words.

Criminal Justice Ministry (CJM) has been a great blessing to me since I paroled out of the Missouri Department of Corrections on 8/1/24, into their transitional housing program for Veterans. After 17 years of incarceration, they have provided me, and continue to provide me, the transitional support and guidance I needed to again become a responsible, moral, law-abiding, productive person.

They assigned me a Case Manager, Carl Williams, who has been helping me from Day One, when he picked me up from the Greyhound Bus station, and he has not stopped assisting me since then. He's been invaluable to me. He spearheaded getting me everything I needed for my daily living, and he has also given me good guidance on other matters. I'm very thankful for Carl.

Today, just 7 months since I was released on Parole, I have: a good job, Social Security Retirement income, a 722 FICO Credit Score, 3 bank accounts, and 4 credit cards (which I maintain zero balances on). I also have a very comfortable apartment to live in, and plenty of food to eat and clothes to wear.

Yes, I count my blessings for CJM and Carl Williams. It hard to say, for sure, how my transition would have gone without them, but I know it's been a blessing from God to have their help and support. My sincere "Thank You" goes out to the entire CJM staff!
